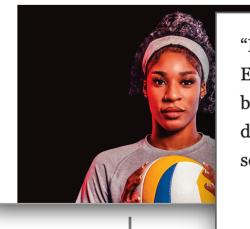

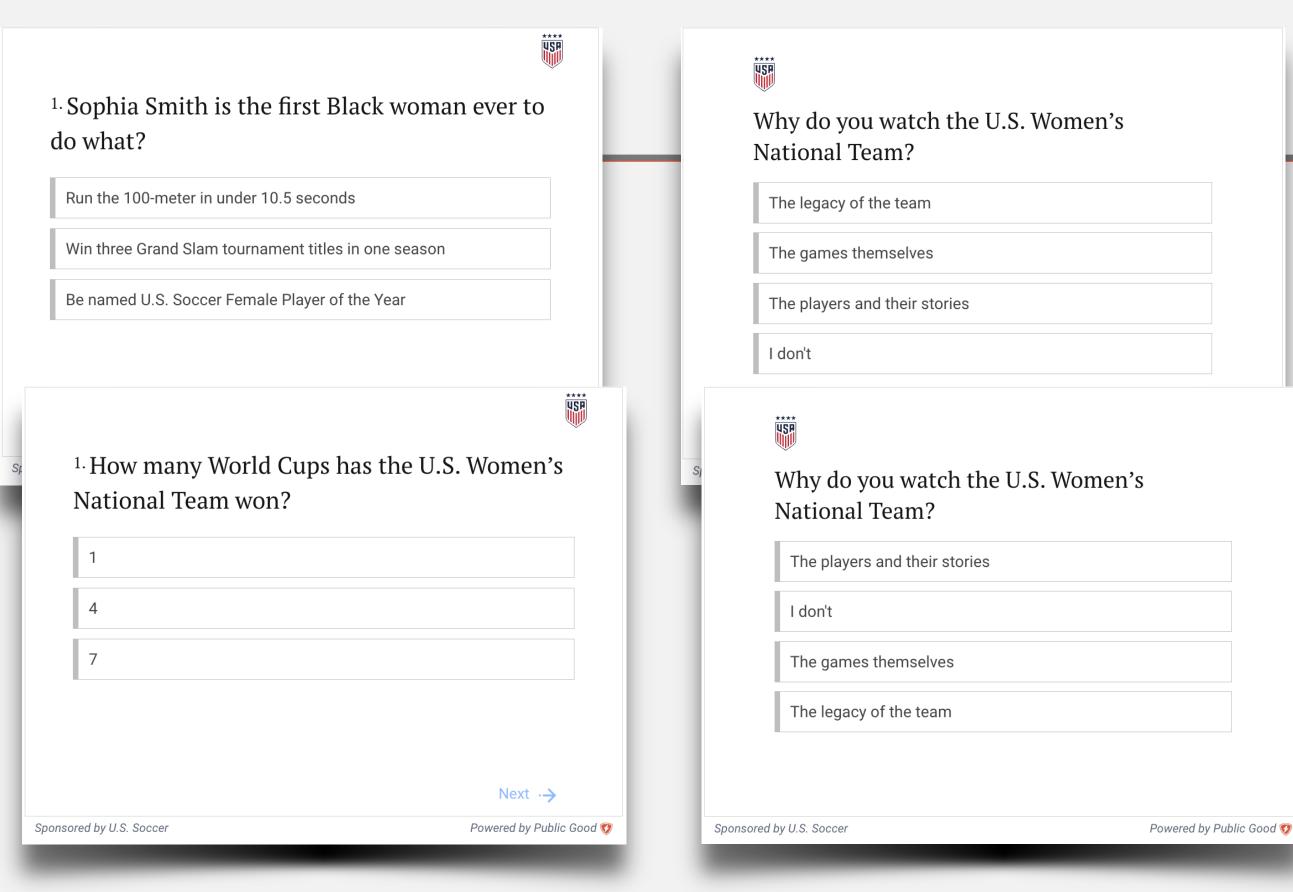
#### **Quiz and Poll**

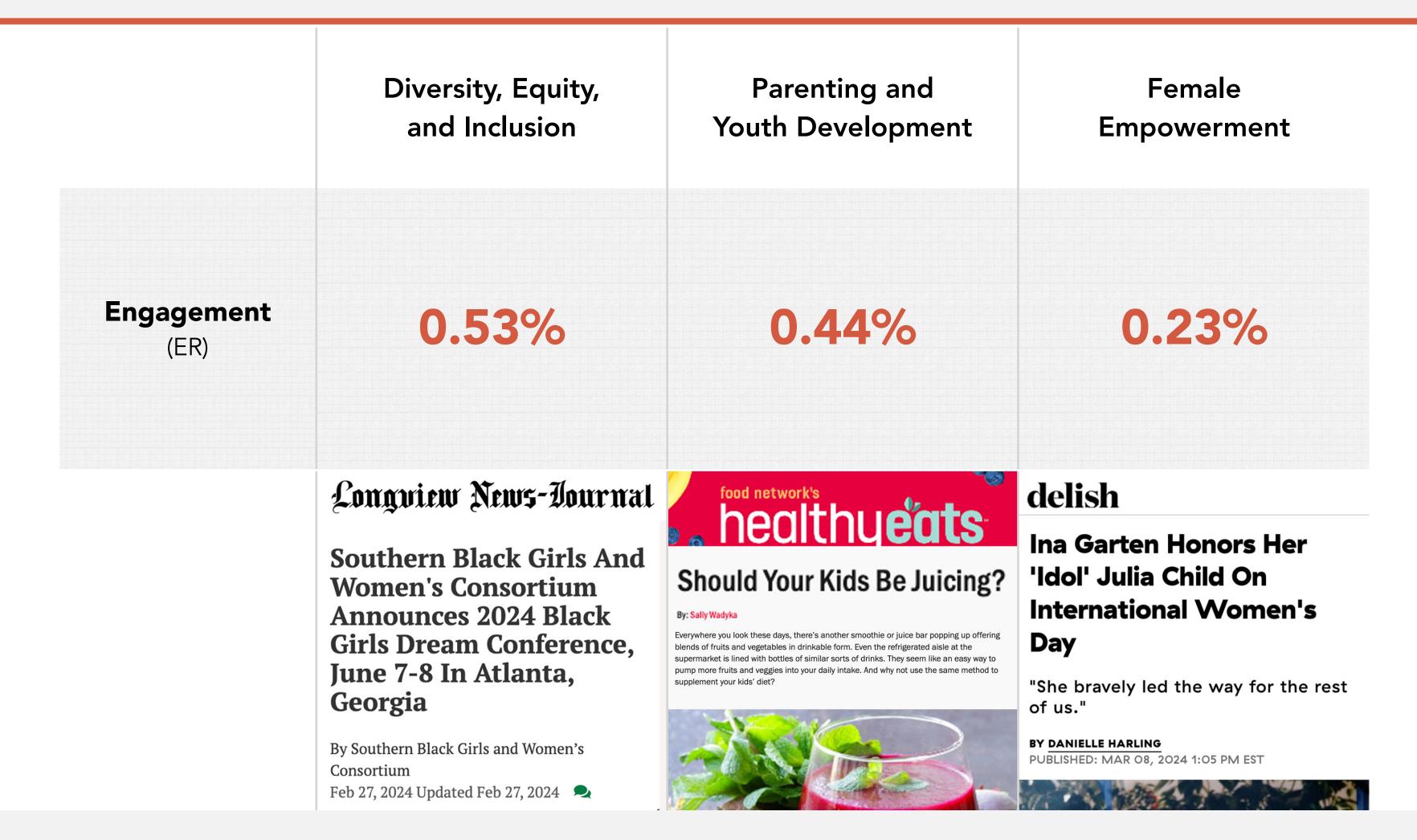

The quiz units drove the primary campaign goals of engagement and awareness in addition to giving us valuable insights into into **how much people know** about U.S. Women's Soccer.



#### **INSIGHTS**

Overall, readers in Atlanta know more than readers in Chicago about both team facts. This may indicate opportunities for greater education in Chicago and audience capitalization in Atlanta.

The top score of just 57.49% correct across the matrix shows room for increased education and awareness in both markets.

## Performance: Engagement by Variant

## Engagement rates among the quizzes differed by market and creative.

Atlantan readers engaged more with the quiz featuring Sophia Smith as the first question, while Chicagoans engaged more when asked first about how many World Cups the team has won.



#### **INSIGHTS**

The largest engagement rate difference among the units was on quizzes leading with the Sophia Smith question, which scored almost 25% higher in Atlanta than in Chicago. This may indicate a greater appetite for player stories in Atlanta.

#### Poll Results:

## Drove Engagement and Awareness and Insights Into How People Feel

The poll unit drove the primary campaign goal of engagement and awareness in addition to giving us valuable insights into **how people feel** about U.S. Women's Soccer. We tested two poll variants each in Atlanta and Chicago.



#### **INSIGHTS**

Just over half of all respondents say they don't watch the U.S. Women's National Team, indicating that (1) the campaign reached non-soccer fans, and (2) the team has a great opportunity to grow its market to new audiences.

While results were similar, more respondents in Atlanta indicated that they do not watch U.S. Women's Soccer games.

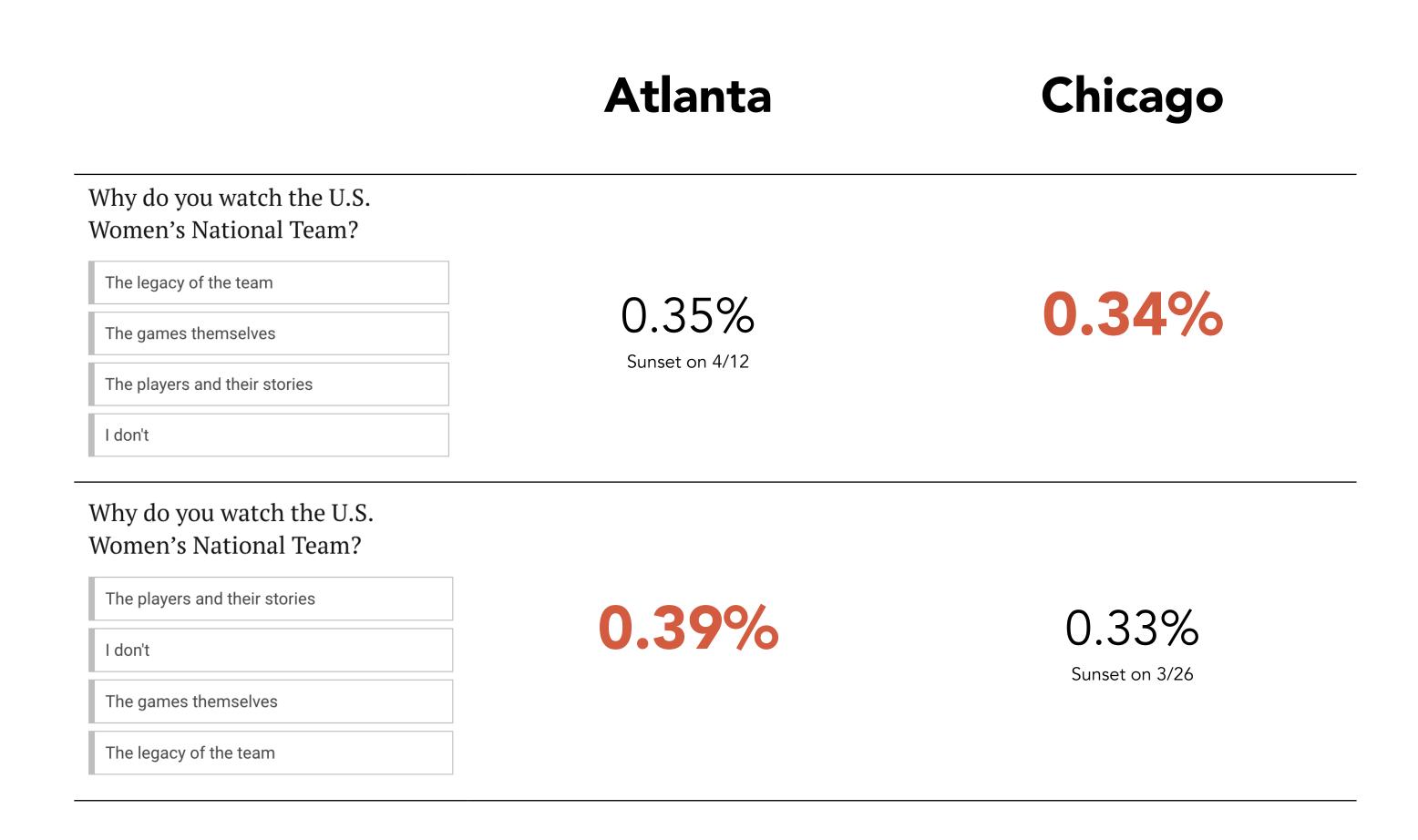
Engagement rates among the polls differed by market and creative.



#### **INSIGHTS**

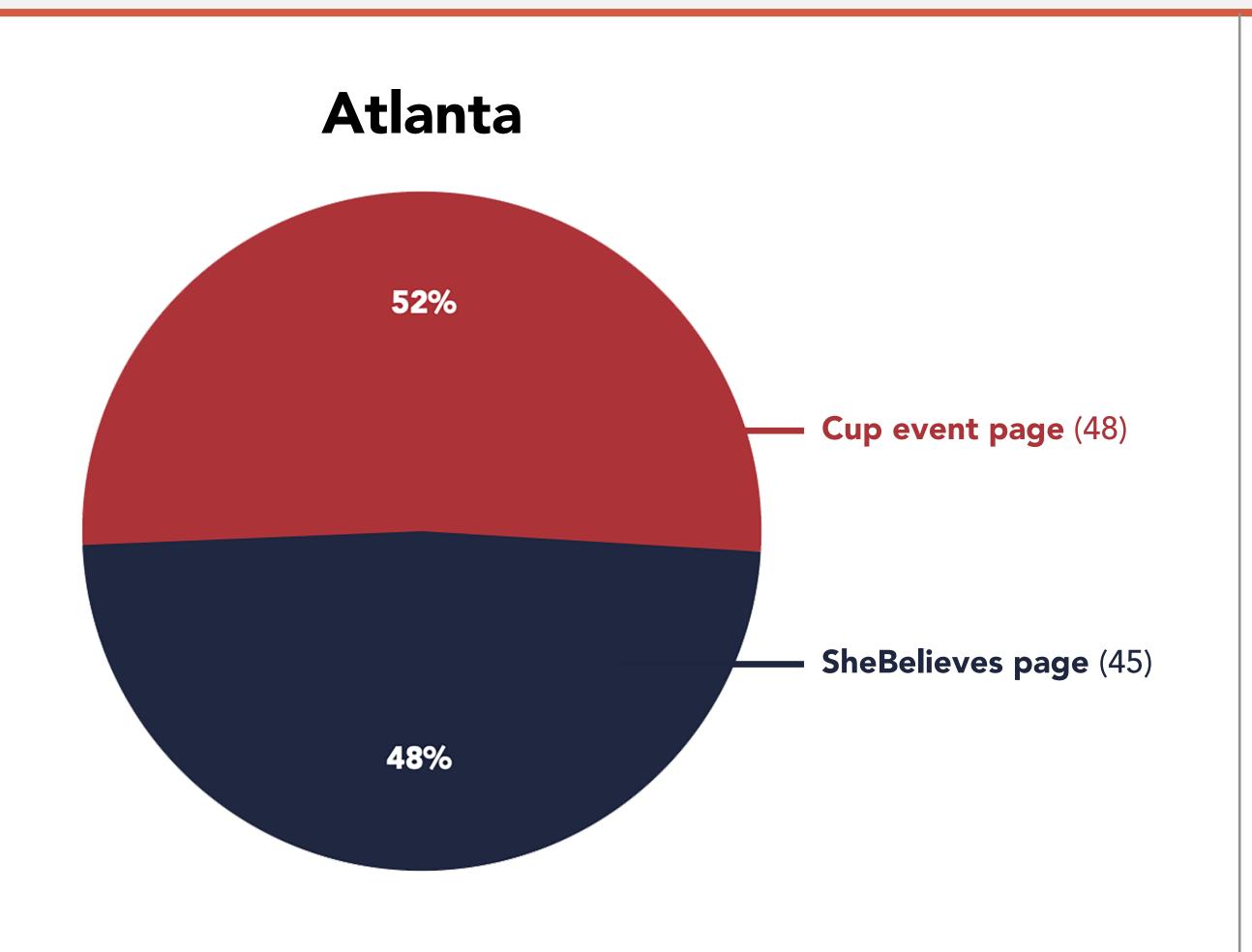

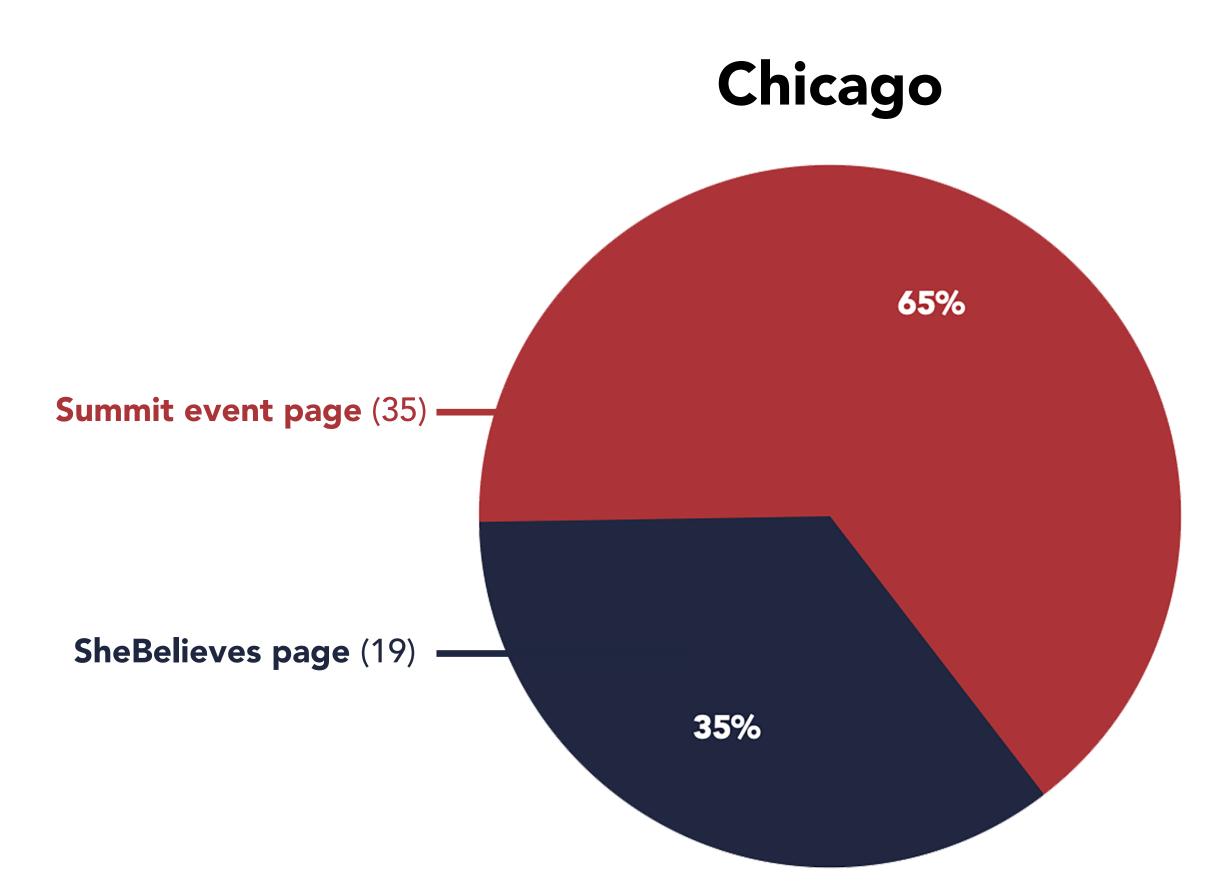

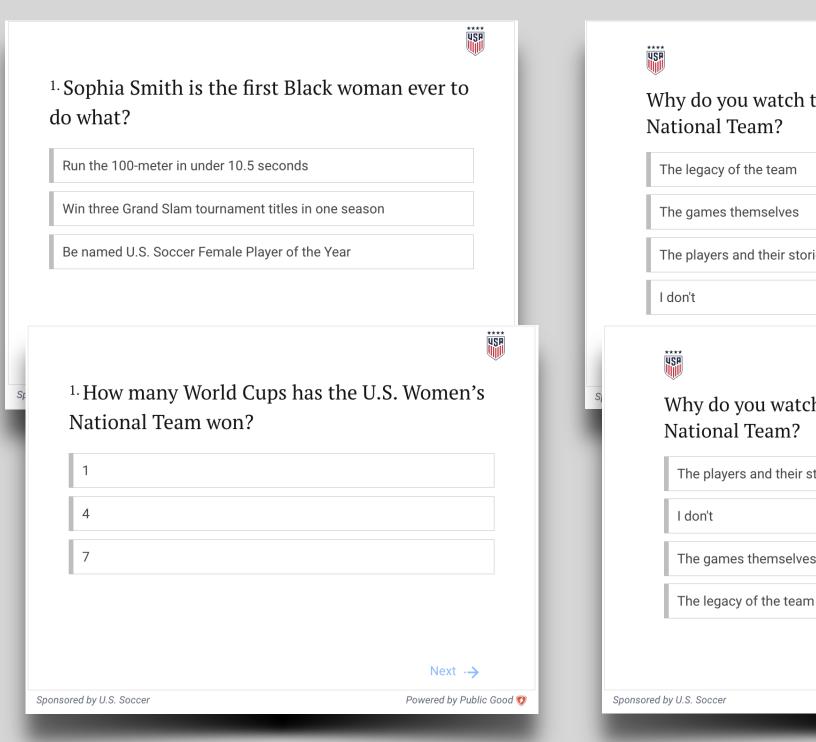

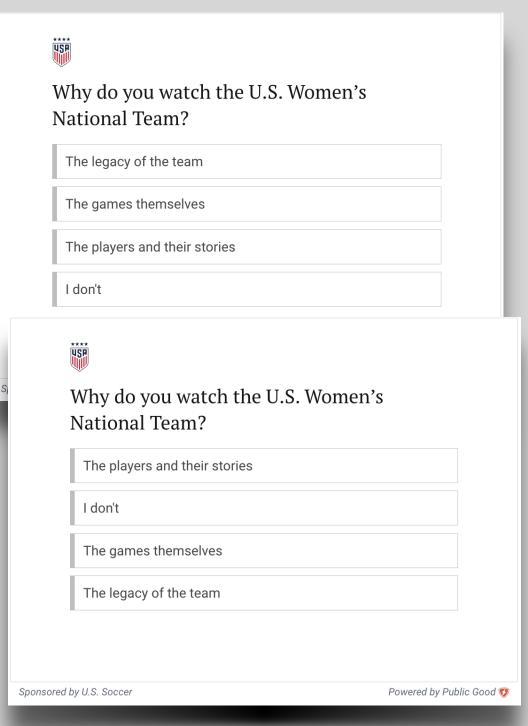
#### **Breakdown of Actions Taken**

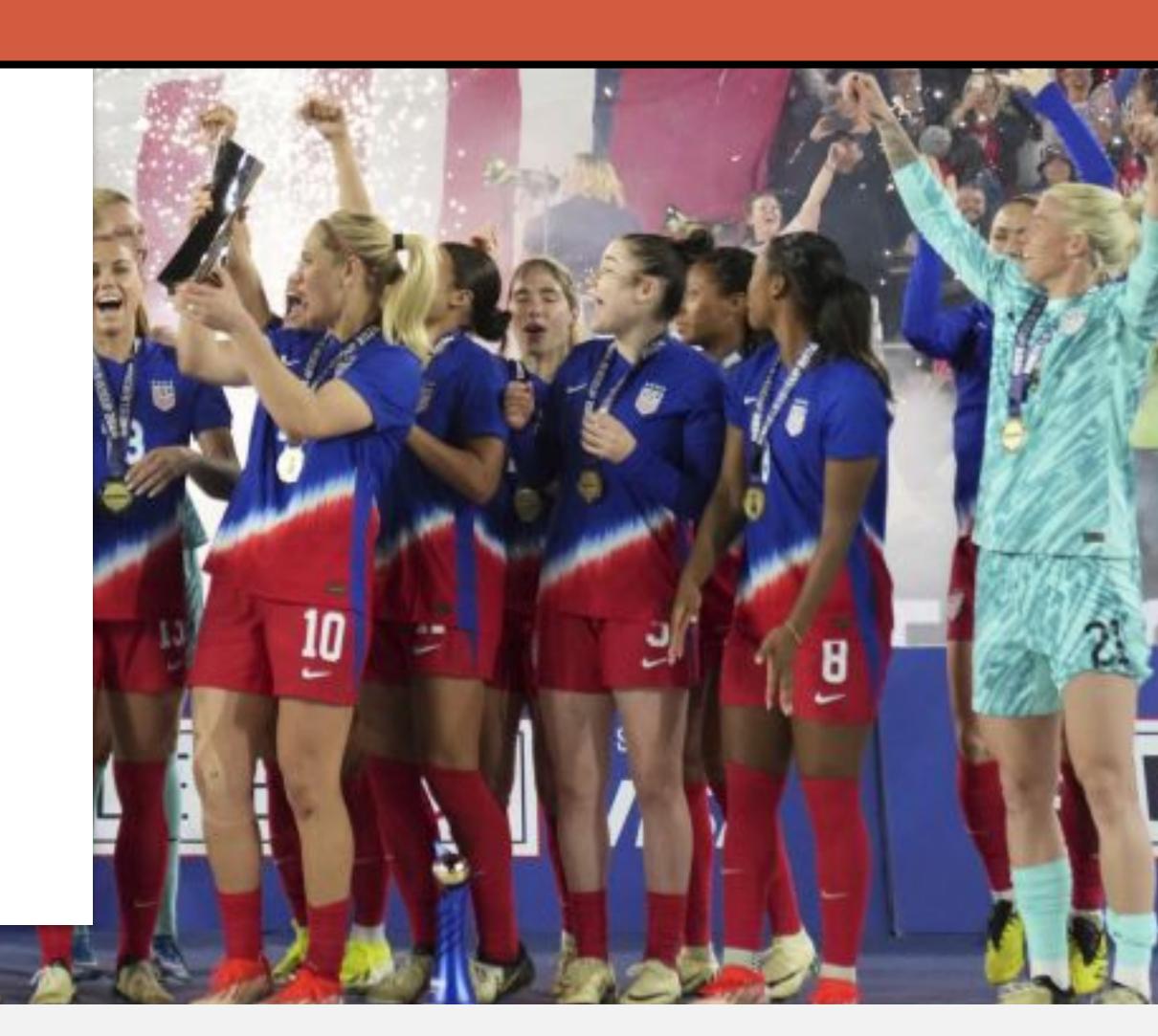

# Successes and Recommendations



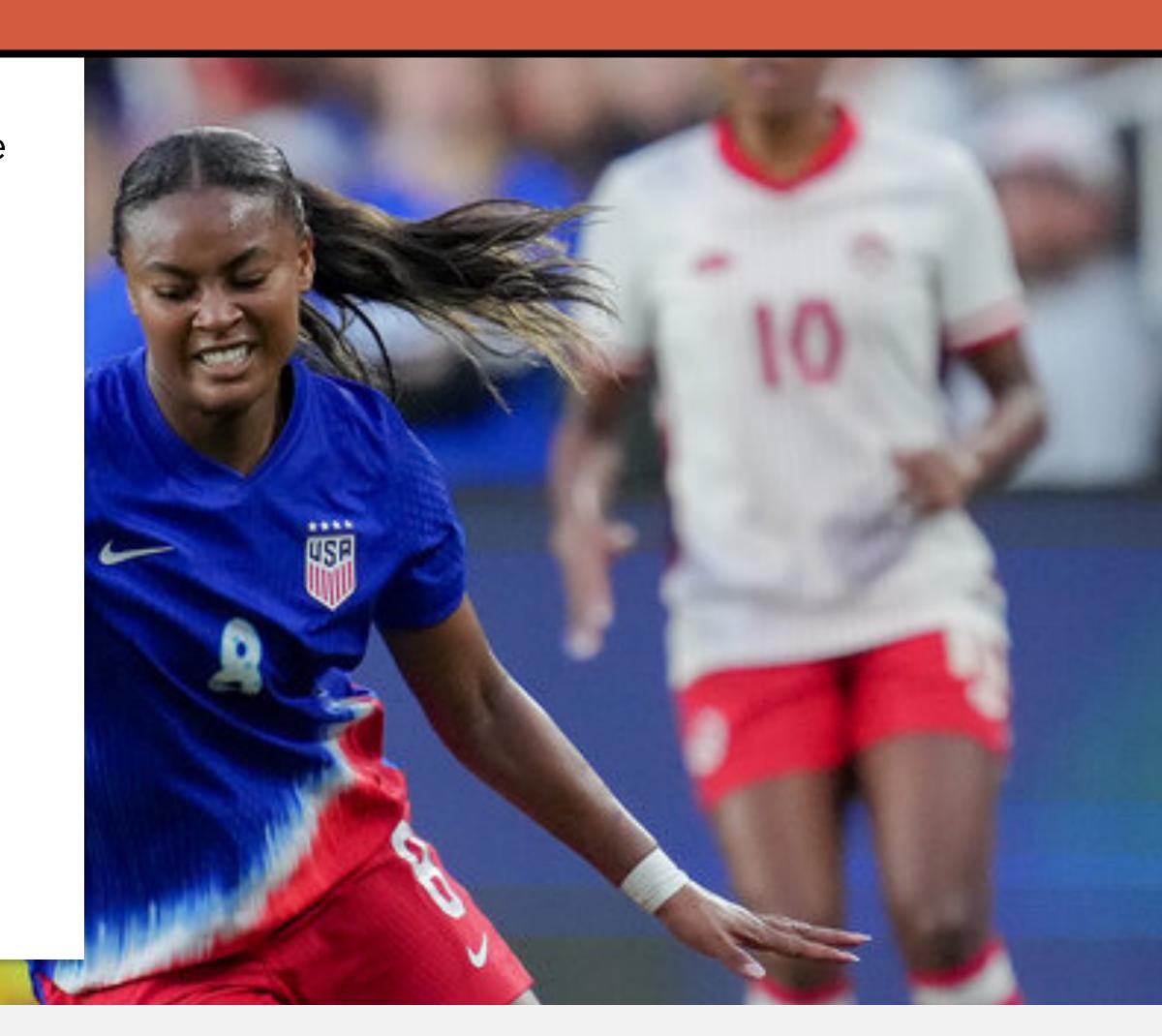
### **Key Successes**

### Recommendations

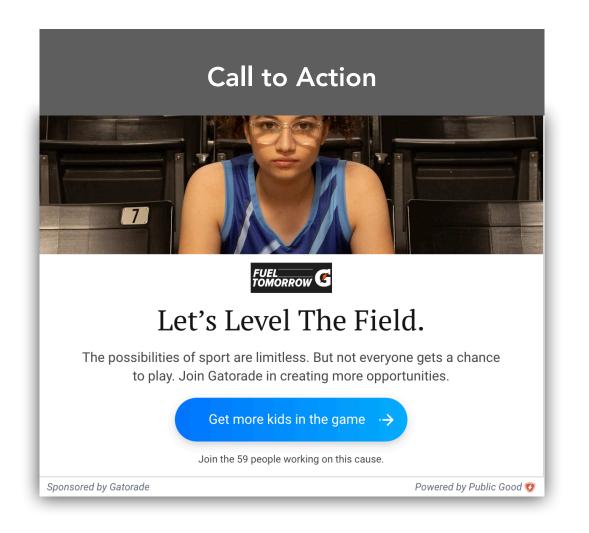
- Expand nationally from geo-targeted campaign to continue to drive engagement and awareness in U.S. Women's soccer in addition to gathering more valuable marketing insights.
- Continue running quiz units to further educate readers and get them familiar with the amazing accomplishments of the U.S. Women's Soccer team.
- Introduce new units, including the slideshow and interactive video, to highlight individual player's stories and thus tell a story.
- Utilize a **Kantar brand study** to measure awareness and sentiment.

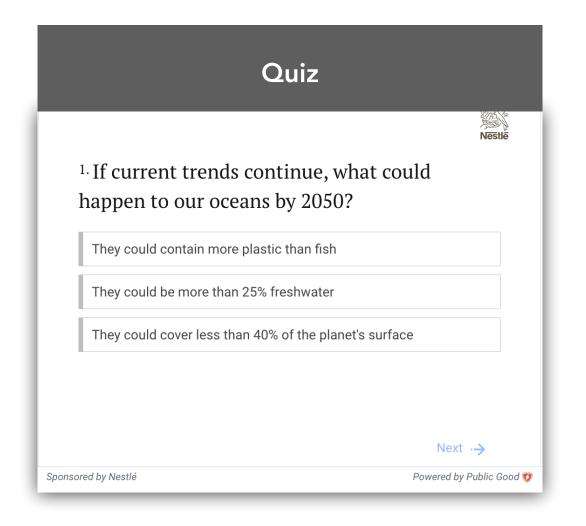


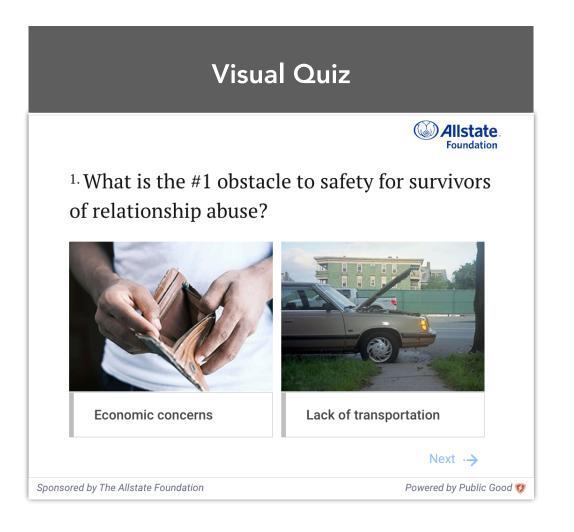


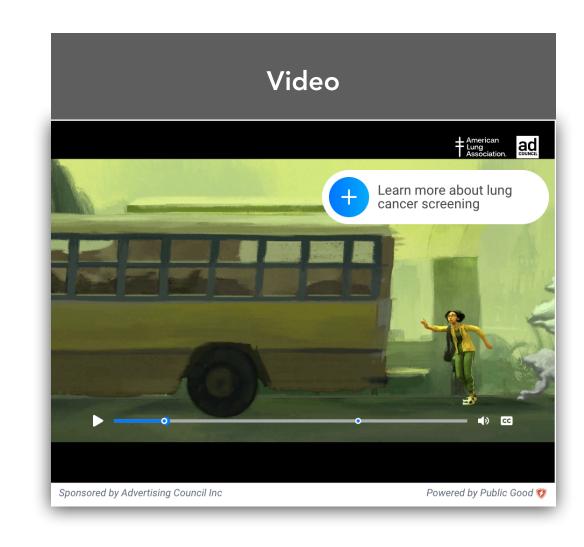
